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Highlights

- The findings in this report are based on the 36 Schools of Nursing in Tennessee that offer Diploma, Associate, Baccalaureate, or graduate degree nursing programs. The schools were surveyed in Fall 2005 and the report is based upon October 2005 data. Of these 36 Schools of Nursing, 19 are affiliated with public colleges and universities, 12 are within private-religious institutions, and five (5) are under the administrative control of private-independent colleges and universities.

Enrollment as of October 15, 2005

- A total of 16 students are enrolled in the one remaining Diploma program in Tennessee; 19% are male and 25% are from racial and ethnic minorities. This program is scheduled to close in Spring 2006.
- A total of 3,039 students are enrolled in the 13 Associate Degree Programs in Tennessee; 12% are male and 17% are from racial and ethnic minorities.
- A total of 3,539 students are enrolled in the 21 Baccalaureate Initial RN Licensure programs and 746 are enrolled in the 19 RN-BSN programs for a grand total of 4,285 Baccalaureate Degree nursing students. Males account for 11% of all BSN nursing students and 18% are from racial and ethnic minorities.
- A total of 372 students are enrolled in two (2) Master's for Initial RN Licensure programs, 945 in 14 Master's Degree programs, and 38 in seven (7) Post-Master's Certificate for a grand total of 1,355 Master's Degree/Post-Master's Certificate nursing students. Males account for 13% of all MSN nursing students and 14% are from racial and ethnic minorities.
- A total of 157 students are enrolled in four (4) Doctoral Degree programs; 8% are male and 20% are from racial and ethnic minorities.

Graduations from October 16, 2004 – October 15, 2005

- A total of 73 students graduated from the Diploma program; 16% were male and 8% were from racial and ethnic minorities.
- A total of 1,172 students graduated from Associate Degree programs; 10% were male and 14% were from racial and ethnic minorities.
- A total of 961 students graduated from Baccalaureate Initial RN Licensure programs and 303 graduated from RN-BSN programs for a grand total of 1,264 Baccalaureate Degree nursing graduates. Males accounted for 8% of all BSN graduates and 14% were from racial and ethnic minorities.
- A total of 145 students graduated from the Master's for Initial RN Licensure programs, 344 from Master's Degree programs and 40 completed Post-Master's Certificates for a grand total of 529 Master's Degree/Post-Master's Certificate nursing graduates. Males accounted for 11% of all MSN graduates and 13% were from racial and ethnic minorities.
- A total of 26 students graduated from the Doctoral Degree programs; 8% were male and 19% were from racial and ethnic minorities.

Two-year Comparisons in Enrollment (Based on data from the same institutions reporting in both 2004 and 2005)

- Enrollment in all Associate Degree programs has significantly increased by 8% (228 students) over the past two years ($p=.004$).
- Enrollment in Baccalaureate Initial RN Licensure programs has increased by 12% (386 students) and the RN-BSN enrollment has increased by 11% (75 students). Enrollment in all Baccalaureate Degree programs has significantly increased by 12% (461 students) over the past two years ($p=.043$).
- Enrollment in the Master's for Initial RN Licensure programs has increased by 1% (4 students) and the RN-MSN enrollment has increased by 22% (171 students). Enrollment in all Master's Degree/Post-Master's Certificate programs has significantly increased by 17% (194 students) over the past two years ($p=.003$).
- Enrollment in the Doctoral Degree programs has increased by 38% (43 students) over the past 2 years.
- Overall enrollment in all nursing programs in Tennessee has increased significantly by 11% over the past two years ($p=.001$)

Four-year Comparison in Enrollment (Based on data from the same institutions reporting in all years 2002-2005)

- Enrollment in all Associate Degree programs has significantly increased by 30% (701 students) over the past four years ($p=.024$). The average increase over the four years is approximately 7.5% (175 students) per year.
- Enrollment in all Baccalaureate Degree programs has significantly increased by 69% (1,744 students) over the past four years ($p=.019$). The average increase over the four years is approximately 17% (436 students) per year.
- Enrollment in all Master's Degree/Post Master's Certificate programs has increased by 73% (571 students) over the past four years. The average increase of the four years is approximately 18% (143 students) per year.
- Four year data is not available for Doctoral Degree programs.
- Overall enrollment in all nursing programs in Tennessee has significantly increased by 51% over the past 4 years ($p<.001$). The average increase of the four years is approximately 13% per year.

Two-year Comparison in Graduations (Based on data from the same institutions reporting in both 2004 and 2005)

- The number of graduates in all Associate Degree programs has increased by 18% (176 students) of the past two years.
- The number of graduates in the Baccalaureate Initial RN Licensure programs has increased by 27% (205 students), and the RN-BSN graduates has increased by 14% (38 students). The number of graduates in all Baccalaureate Degree programs has significantly increased by 24% (243 students) over the past two years ($p=.027$).
- The number of graduates in the Master's for Initial RN Licensure programs has increased by 4% (5 students) and the RN-MSN graduates has increased by 35% (89 students). The number of graduates in all Master's Degree/Post-Master's Certificate programs has significantly increased by 30% (122 students) over the past two years ($p=.013$).
- The number of graduates in the Doctoral Degree programs has increased by 44% (8 students) over the past two years.
- Overall, the number of graduates in all nursing programs in Tennessee has significantly increased by 22% over the past two years ($p<.001$).

Retention Rates

- The average retention rate of all Associate Degree programs was 71.2%.
- The average retention rate of all Baccalaureate Degree programs was 88.2%.
- The average retention rate of all Master's Degree programs was 94.2%.

Faculty Summary

- For all 36 Schools of Nursing, there are 708 full-time Nursing Faculty and 336 part-time (headcount) Nursing Faculty for a total of 1,044 Nursing Faculty. Of those 1,044, 12% are from racial and ethnic minorities.
- Fourteen schools (38.9%) reported having a total of 36 budgeted, unfilled full-time nursing faculty positions. Of those 14 schools, 9 (64.3%) are from public institutions.
- Of the 36 Schools of Nursing, seven (7) (19.4%) schools reported a total of seven Nurse Faculty retirements.
- Of the 36 Schools of Nursing, 24 (66.7%) schools reported a total 69 Nurse Faculty resignations. Ten of those are due to the closing of the Diploma program. The most frequent reasons reported for Nurse Faculty resignations were return to clinical practice and salary/benefits.
